**Students transferring from another Texas public college or university may take up to 3 hours of math which meet that institutions core curriculum requirements. The remaining 3 hours of math must meet a TAMU core math course. Out-of-state or private university applicants must have 6 hours which meet the [TAMU Core Curriculum](#).

Transfer Course Sheet Notes

1. Due to enrollment constraints, admission into the program is extremely competitive with a limited number of spaces available each year. Entry is available three times per year for Spring, Summer and Fall.
2. Proficiency in a foreign language is required to graduate from Texas A&M University. This requirement can be met by having completed two years of the same foreign language in high school, by completing two semesters of the same foreign language at the university level, or by demonstrating proficiency in a foreign language by examination.
3. Admission preference is given to applicants with the highest GPA and the most appropriate courses completed.
4. This Transfer Course Sheet was supported in a partnership between The Office of Admissions and College of Nursing at Texas A&M University with the Undergraduate Catalog and Nursing website having the most extensive and definitive information.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- Second choice majors **will not** be considered.
- Must complete two applications: 1) NursingCAS Application and 2) Apply Texas Transfer application to Texas A&M University
- A minimum of 8 of 12 of the following prerequisite courses are recommended to be completed with a GPR of 3.2 or greater at the time of application: English Composition, General Psych, Ethics or Philosophy, General Biology, Lifespan G&D Psych, 6 hours of Math, Nutrition, Anatomy & Physiology I & II, Chemistry, Microbiology. These must be reflected on the transcript(s) submitted with the application. If more than 8 courses are complete when the application is submitted, grades in all complete courses will be included in the prerequisite GPA calculation.
- **In addition to the prereq GPA, a cumulative GPR for all college coursework and a Nursing Science GPA is considered in the selection process.**
- Admissions Assessment Exam (HESI A2) Complete the following five (5) components plus critical thinking:
 1. Math
 2. Reading Comprehension
 3. Vocabulary and General Knowledge
 4. Grammar
 5. Anatomy and Physiology
- Students must have a minimum Overall GPA of a 3.00 (on a 4.0 scale). To be competitive it is strongly recommended that applicants present a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- **Overview and Profile of Traditional BSN Class Entering July/August 2016** - The College received 340 applications for 48 seats at the Bryan-College Station campus. Among the students enrolled, the average overall GPA was 3.88, the average Nursing Science GPA was 3.9 and the average cumulative Admissions Assessment HESI score was a 92. Overall GPAs of admitted students ranged from 3.46 to 4.0. Of the 48 students admitted, 9 came from institutions other than Texas A&M University.
- **Overview and Profile of Traditional BSN Class Entering July 2015** - The College received 324 applications for 88 seats on the Bryan/College Station Campus. Among the students enrolled, the average overall GPA was 3.72, the average Nursing Science GPA was 3.77, and the average cumulative Admissions Assessment HESI score was a 90.6. Overall GPAs of admitted students ranged from 3.13 to 4.0. Of the 50 students admitted, 17 came from institutions other than Texas A&M University.
