- Applicants must have completed 6 hours of MATH. One course must be from MATH 140 or MATH 141 or MATH 166 **AND** MATH 142.
- Students may have to complete College Algebra (MATH 1314) at their institution before taking MATH 1324 or 1325.
- A minimum of 6 hours of any combination of AG ECON 105, Economics and/or Accounting coursework listed in Required Coursework.
- **Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.75 and a minimum 2.75 GPA in Priority Coursework. Priority Coursework includes all of the above listed courses plus MGMT 211.**
- Repeated courses are included in all GPA calculations.
- To complete the Communication requirement, 2 of the following courses are needed: ENGL 103, ENGL 104, COMM 203.
- In your essay, please be sure to address how an Agribusiness degree will help you meet your career goals. If you have 3 or more grades of D's, F's, Q's, NG's and/or W's explain why the grades occurred.

Admission to the Agribusiness program is competitive. Completion of the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. Students admitted into Agribusiness have an average overall and Priority Coursework GPR of 3.5.

The recommendations below represent what a typical TAMU student's schedule looks like during the first four semesters. If working to complete an Associate's Degree before transferring, please align your degree plan to satisfy TAMU degree requirements. You may not have to complete the coursework in the sequence below but this major requires or recommends specific coursework to be completed.

- Many community colleges have removed MGMT 211 from their course offerings. Blinn College offers BUSI 2371, which is an accepted MGMT 211 equivalent. - Consider taking courses that fulfill the 6 hours of [International and Cultural Diversity requirement](#) when completing the Language Philosophy and Culture, free electives and Creative Arts requirements.

Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the Required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- The Department of Agricultural Economics is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. Students should indicate our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing our degree.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.
- Highly recommend meeting with an academic advisor prior to submitting the application.

Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in Agricultural Economics.
- Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

1. Admission preference is given to applicants with the highest GPA and the most appropriate courses completed.
2. Transfer applicants are encouraged to complete [University Core Curriculum](#) coursework found in the [Undergraduate Catalog](#) unless specified above.
