- The Department of Communication & Journalism will accept AP/IB credit when applicable. Please DO NOT retake classes for which you have AP/IB credit.
- AP/IB scores must be submitted at the time of application to be considered for coursework required for admission.

### Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants may wish to have the required and recommended coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term may wish to have the required and recommended coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

### Additional Transfer Requirements

- Transfer applicants should have completed a full semester (spring or fall) course load of 12 transferable hours (minimum) after graduating from high school.
- The Department of Communication and Journalism is looking for students who are interested in pursuing one of our five degrees and **graduating** with a degree in either Communication or in Telecommunication Media Studies or University Studies-Journalism Studies. Students should indicate our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. For this degree, the essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing our BS-Communication degree.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.
- Maximum credit hours listed are hours completed at the time of application. All courses completed, regardless of degree applicability, are considered including transcribed credit by exam hours.
- Applicants cannot select which hours are transferable, or opt to exclude completed hours, and all hours will be factored when calculating maximum transferable hours.

### Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in Communication or Telecommunication Media Studies or University Studies-Journalism Studies
- Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

### Career & Educational Opportunities

Communication, as a discipline, is often interested in how messages are crafted and how people interpret and act on those messages. In the BS-COMM, we teach you how to analyze situations, design and conduct background research, collect, analyze, display and evaluate data, and create messages which allow you to intervene for mutual benefit in contexts ranging from Global Media, Health Communication, Social Justice, Strategic Communication (public relations, integrated marketing communication, advertising, promotions,) Social Media, or Leadership and Conflict Management, to name a few. Whether you are intervening to sell products and conduct business, promote people or ideas, or work to foster political, religious or social ideas, the principles and practice of communication intervention, serve well.

The BS-COMM and the BA-COMM share some coursework. The BA-COMM has an arts and humanities orientation and is supported by the study of four semesters of foreign language. The BS-COMM has a communication science and practice emphasis and rather than foreign language, is supported by quantitative and research design coursework. Study abroad is encouraged though not required.



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COMM students acquire a significant set of marketable skills, create a portfolio to display their projects to future employers and are well positioned for the work world, for graduate programs and professional school admission.
