Both POLS 206 and 207 are strongly preferred for transfer admissions. However, the department could accept either a non-Texas state and local government class (e.g. Oklahoma state government) or, if such a class is not offered, any other 3-hour government course towards POLS major electives as part of admission review. Applicants are encouraged to address the lack of a POLS 207 equivalent in their transfer application essay as POLS 207 will be a requirement of this degree.

- Maximum Transferable Hours are hours completed at the time of application. See "Additional Transfer Requirements" on page 2 of this document for more information.
- Required courses listed must be completed with a grade of C or better.
- Trigonometry, College Algebra (MATH 1314), Pre-Calculus, and Statistics are transferable courses but **will not** satisfy the Mathematics requirements in this degree plan.
- Bachelors of Arts applicants are encouraged to complete at least 2 semesters (6 hours) of degree-applicable math before applying for transfer.
- Bachelors of Arts applicants who did not complete 2 years of the same foreign language in high school are encouraged to complete 2 semesters (8 hours) of the same college level foreign language before applying for transfer as this is a degree requirement for all Bachelor of Arts degree plans at TAMU.
- ENGL 1301 is a transferable course but may not satisfy the Communication requirements in this degree plan.
- AP/IB scores must be submitted at the time of application to be considered for coursework required for admission.
- The Department of Political Science will accept AP/IB credit when applicable. DO NOT retake classes for which you have AP/IB credit.

The recommendations below represent what a typical TAMU student's schedule looks like during the first four semesters. If working to complete an Associate's Degree before transferring, please align your degree plan to satisfy TAMU degree requirements. You may not have to complete the coursework in the sequence below but this major requires or recommends specific coursework to be completed.

#### **Coursework Timeline**

- Applications to the summer/fall term **may** be asked to submit spring final grades. Competitive applicants will have Required and Recommended coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Summer coursework will not be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework will not be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required and Recommended coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before
  applying.

#### **Additional Transfer Requirements**

- Transfer applicants should have completed a full semester (spring or fall) course load of 12 transferable hours (minimum) after graduating from high school.
- Maximum credit hours listed are hours completed at the time of application. The department strongly recommends that students apply for transfer as early as possible.
- The Department of Political Science is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing our degree.
- All courses completed, regardless of degree applicability, are considered including accepted credit by exam hours. Applicants cannot select which hours are transferable, or opt to exclude completed hours, all completed hours will be factored when calculating total credit hours completed. All courses completed, regardless of degree applicability, are considered including transcripted credit by exam hours.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

## **Career & Educational Opportunities**

Political science is the study of governments, the processes by which government officials and institutions make public policies, and the effects of those policies on society. The governments of all nations – and all levels of government such as those for cities and states as well as national governments – are subjects of study in this discipline. Political science also researches the political attitudes and behavior of citizens and of those individuals who hold official government positions. It also examines the relationships among the nations of the world. Among other things, political science addresses power, authority, influence, identity, ethics, law, liberty, justice, wealth, and violence.

The study of political science introduces students to a powerful set of analytical tools for understanding interactions within and among groups of people. These include systematic knowledge of recurring patterns and problems in political life and methods for collecting and analyzing data and other forms of evidence. Studying political science also cultivates critical thinking and effective communication and prepares students for active citizenship, professional success, and lifelong learning.
