- Students with less than 45 completed hours must have completed 21 hours of TAMU core curriculum, including 1 core curriculum MATH class.
- Students with 45 or more completed hours must have completed all of the core curriculum.
- No more than 3 hours may be used from MATH 141, 140, or 166 in this degree plan.
- Trigonometry and Pre-Calculus are transferable courses but will not satisfy the Mathematics requirements in this degree plan.
- Students may have to complete College Algebra (MATH 1314) at their institution before taking MATH 1324 or 1325.
- College Algebra is a transferable courses but will not satisfy the Mathematics requirements in this degree plan.

If working to complete an Associate's Degree before transferring, please align your degree plan to satisfy TAMU degree requirements. You may not have to complete the coursework in the sequence below but this major requires specific coursework to be completed.

- Competitive applicants will have the Required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- The Department of Agricultural Leadership, Education, and Communications is looking for students who are interested in completing the Agricultural Communications and Journalism degree.
- Agricultural Communications and Journalism is **NOT** a transitional major.
- The essay and supporting materials should reflect interest, and/or experience in Communications and Journalism.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in Agricultural Communications and Journalism.
- Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.
- In order to successfully meet requirements, students are encouraged to meet with the program advisor prior to starting the transfer process.

Career & Educational Opportunities

Students in this program gain real-world knowledge in print, broadcast, and web communications.
