Additional Transfer Requirements

- Transfer applicants should have completed a full semester (spring or fall) course load of 12 transferable hours (minimum) after graduating from high school.
- The Interdisciplinary Critical Studies program is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. Students should indicate
 our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the
 student is interested in pursuing our degree.
- · Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

Additional Information

 Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

Career & Educational Opportunities

The Health Humanities is a growing, cross-disciplinary field that practices the analysis of health and illness within cultural activities and products. Students of the Health Humanities may use methods of analysis drawn from history, literature, philosophy, bioethics, and comparative religion, as well as social sciences (i.e., sociology, anthropology, and psychology) in order to better understand the lived experience of health and illness. Health Humanities serves to question the 'two cultures' thesis that postulates the sciences and humanities are separate, arguing instead that our experience of health and illness is never only biological or 'cultural,' but always both. Grounding in this interdisciplinary field prepares undergraduates with skills and knowledge relevant to careers in healthcare or graduate school in humanities or social sciences.
