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Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term may be asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework will not be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester prior to submitting
 application.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- The Department of Agricultural Leadership, Education, and Communications is looking for students who are interested in completing the Agricultural Leadership and Development degree.
- Agricultural Leadership and Development is **NOT** a transitional major.
- It is recommended the essay and supporting materials reflect interest, and/or experience in leadership and/or agriculture.

- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in Agricultural Leadership and Development.
- Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.
- Contacting an academic advisor in this department is strongly recommended prior to application.

Career & Educational Opportunities

Focused on people, this major provides study in leadership and the human dimension of the agricultural industry. Students combine a foundation in human relation skills with elements of business, multiculturalism, policy, technology, and biological sciences. The curriculum in agricultural leadership and development is multidisciplinary, designed to develop students for leadership positions in local, state, regional, and national groups, organizations, and agencies that are involved in the agricultural industry.
