#### Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

#### Additional Transfer Requirements

- Transfer applicants should have completed 24 hours of coursework, which include one math and two science courses from the list above, at time of application. Courses in progress at time of application are not considered in our review for transfer admission.
- Students should strive to complete one math and two science courses from the list above with grades of 'C' or better.
- Students should strive to maintain a cumulative GPR of 2.75 or greater on all college courses that transfer to TAMU.
- The Teaching, Learning, and Culture Department is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degrees as a focus. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing one of our degrees.
- Meeting minimum requirements **does not** guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

#### Additional Information

- Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.
