• INST 210 must be completed with a grade of B or higher. This course is prerequisite for admission into professional phase.

• It is highly recommended that a student begins attending TAMU spring semester of the second year due to the course sequence of the special education program. The recommended list of courses for the spring semester of the second year will vary depending on if the student is attending TAMU or still attending a community college. During that semester, there may be limited options of courses to take while at a community college.

• Students will apply to professional phase (upper level) once he/she is a special education major at TAMU (the advisor will provide additional information regarding this process).

Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term may be asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.



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- Fall coursework will not be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the required coursework completed by the end of summer II semester before applying.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- Transfer applicants should have completed at least 24 hours of coursework which includes completion of one math and two science courses at the time of application. Courses in progress at the time of application are not considered in our review for transfer admission.
- Students should strive to maintain a cumulative GPR of 2.75 or greater on all college courses that transfer to TAMU.
- The Department of Educational Psychology is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degrees as a focus. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing one of our degree programs.
- Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission as the entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

Additional Information

• Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

Career & Educational Opportunities

This major focuses on the education of students with special needs in a way that addresses the students' individual differences and needs. The degree program provides certifications in EC-12 Special Education and EC-6 General education and provides field experiences with students including those with disabilities in classroom and community settings. Students may also sit for the ESL certification exam to receive their ESL certification. The required coursework is built into the Special Education degree plan.
