- Competitive applicants will have the Required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

Additional Transfer Requirements

- This department is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. Students should indicate our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing our degree.
- This is a competitive application process. Meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in University Studies Global Planning, Design & Construction.
- Transfer applicants are instructed NOT to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

Career & Educational Opportunities

This interdisciplinary major integrates multiple aspects of the built environment. It is compiled of several architecture foundation courses from all four college departments (Architecture, Construction Science, Landscape Architecture and Urban Planning) and is intended to give students an understanding of the interplay of professions that are required to work as a team in order to successfully complete built environment projects.
