- A grade of **C** or better is required in all courses.
- CHEM 1405 & 1407 or CHEM 1411 & 1412. If courses are taken at TAMU, 101, 111, 102, 112 are advised since there is no equivalent for 1407.
- 3 hours of college level math are required (developmental courses will not count)  
 \*All courses must be completed by summer I of entry semester.

**Coursework Timeline**

- Applicants may apply even though all core and required courses are not complete.
- Applicants must have core and required courses complete by end of summer I session of the year of entry into the program.

**Additional Transfer Requirements**

- Meeting minimum requirements **does not** guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

**Additional Information**

- Approximately 160 students apply each year for the 30 spots in the dental hygiene class.
- Incoming overall and science GPAs have averaged around 3.50 for the last number of years.
- It is important to observe a dental hygienist in practice to become familiar with the responsibilities of a practicing dental hygienist.
- The interview is an opportunity to tell members of the admissions committee about your interest in the profession.
- Applicants should reflect upon the observation experience as well as community opportunities and volunteerism in the online applications.

**To be considered for a position as a student within the college, the applicant must:**

- Have completed the application process
- Have been interviewed
- Have at least 60 hours of coursework completed by end of summer I
- Be core complete\* from incoming institution
- Have documented 16 hours of observation of a dental hygienist
- Have 3 letters of reference submitted on their behalf
- Have met TSI requirements
- Have two years of the same foreign language in high school or one year of foreign language in college (TAMU graduation requirement).

**\*Texas Private College and Out-of-State Applicants:** Applicants must meet the core at Texas A&M University [core.tamu.edu](http://core.tamu.edu) or be core complete at another Texas public college or university. A course which includes Texas Government is required and available at all Texas public Colleges and universities. Please consider enrolling for this course at a Texas public community college or university that aligns best with the courses you have already taken, and which will meet that institution's core. Request your transcript to reflect that you have met their core curriculum- it must say "core complete" on the transcript.

**Transfer Course Sheet Notes**

1. ENGL 1301 is accepted for ENGL 104 if completed prior to Fall 2014.
2. MATH 1324 from some institutions will not be a direct equivalent to MATH 141 at Texas A&M University **but will** satisfy the core math requirement for this major.
