- Students must complete both math classes and two of the four science classes with a B average and no grade less than a C as a requirement for admission. All other coursework should be completed with a grade of C or better.
  - College Algebra and MATH150 are a transferable courses but **will not** satisfy the Mathematics requirements for these degree plans.
- \*BIOL 111 (BIOL 1406) may substitute for BIOL 107, but this would require the student to complete BIOL 112 (BIOL 1407) as well.  
\*\*BIOL 2401 and 2402 are not direct equivalents for BIOL 319 and 320 but may be used for these degrees.

#### Coursework Timeline

- Competitive applicants will have the Required coursework completed by the application deadline.
- Applicants to the summer/fall term **may be** asked to submit spring final grades, this is not a guarantee.
- Summer coursework **will not** be considered for summer/fall applicants.
- Fall coursework **will not** be considered for spring applicants.
- Applicants to the spring term should have the Required coursework completed by the end of Summer II semester before applying.

#### Additional Transfer Requirements

- Transfer applicants should have completed 24 hours of coursework, which include two math and two science courses from the list above, at time of application. Courses in progress at time of application are not considered in our review for transfer admission.
- Students interested in pursuing Allied Health should strive to complete two math and two science courses from the list above with grades of 'B' or better. Students interested in pursuing Community Health should strive to complete two math and two science courses from the list above **with a B average and no grade less than a C.**
- Students should strive to maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or greater on all college courses that transfer to TAMU.
- The Health and Kinesiology Department is looking for students who are interested in pursuing our degree as a focus. Students should indicate our department as the primary major they are interested in if they wish to be admitted. The essay and supporting materials should reflect that the student is interested in pursuing our degree.
- Meeting minimum requirements **does not** guarantee admission. The entire record is reviewed for consistency in coursework and grades.

#### Additional Information

- Applicants should be serious about earning a degree in, Community Health or Health-Allied Health as indicated by their first choice major preference on the Apply Texas Transfer Application.
- Transfer applicants are instructed **NOT** to accept transfer admission to any major with the expectation of later applying for an on-campus change of major.

#### Career & Educational Opportunities

The goals of the curriculum leading to a Bachelor of Science in Health are to more effectively develop literate, informed professionals capable of making the world healthier and more humane. Students receive a general education through a broad exposure to information. They also receive a specialized education through coursework designed to help them develop as a professional, expand their knowledge and skills related to health education and prepare them for professional practice.

The **Community Health** degree prepares and educates students to serve as community health educators and promoters in a variety of government and private health agencies, clinical settings, nonprofit organizations, volunteer agencies and other community organizations. This program is unique in that it offers a wide range of approved electives permitting the student to develop a program according to his or her needs and interests. Each graduate will have knowledge enabling them to communicate health and health education needs, concerns, and resources.

The **Allied Health** option gives students a strong background in health that serves them well if they choose to pursue additional schooling in an allied health area. This concentration provides an opportunity for students to take prerequisite courses for professional allied health schools as electives while receiving a background in the health education field. Students select electives from a list of prerequisites for specific professional schools such as nursing, physical therapy, occupational therapy, physician assistant, etc.
